

## Author guidelines

### Scope

*Global Policy* has a multidisciplinary, interdisciplinary and international outlook. We are committed to developing the accuracy, policy relevance and progressive outlook of academic research. The locus for most of the accepted work in *Global Policy* will lie in economics, global politics, government, international law, international relations and international political economy, but equally the Journal will be relevant to and interested in a much wider range of disciplines. The editors are committed to developing both the highest standards of scholarship and evidence-based reasoning by authors. All scholarly articles are subject to rigorous peer review. We are at the same time committed to the effective communication of research in the most accessible and professional fashion. We seek to engage meaningfully with the widest range of readers and contributors both in the global public policy research fields and in major governments, international organizations, central banks, industries and NGOs dealing with global policy issues.

### Types of articles

**Main articles** should be no more than 8,000 words in length including all references. The purpose of main articles is to analyse new research, reflect on theoretical developments and engage in scholarly debate.

**Survey articles** should be no more than 4,000 words in length. The purpose of survey articles is to map current policy approaches to, and the policy context of, particular issues. These articles also serve to analyse external developments and innovations in areas that have a tangible impact on the policy environment.

**Practitioner commentaries** should be no more than 1,500 words in length. The purpose of practitioner commentaries is to provide policy makers' perspectives on practical aspects of global policy change.

**Review essays** of single books should be no more than 500 words, while reviews covering more than one book may be up to 1,500 words in length. The purpose of review essays is to summarize the text and offer critical analysis of the content.

### How to submit

Authors will soon be able to submit manuscripts to *Global Policy* online using ScholarOne Manuscripts. More information on this service will be made available on this site shortly. In the meantime, manuscripts should be submitted to the editorial office by email ([journal.global.policy@lse.ac.uk](mailto:journal.global.policy@lse.ac.uk)) in Word format with an abstract summarizing the main points of the article and a note about the author. Please see the accompanying Style Guide for full requirements for references, tables and figures.

Please note that submission of a manuscript implies commitment to publish in the Journal. Submission to *Global Policy* implies that the manuscript has not been published elsewhere, nor is it under consideration by another journal. Authors in doubt about what constitutes prior publication should consult the editors.

### Copyright Transfer Agreement

Authors will be required to sign a Copyright Transfer Agreement (CTA) for all papers accepted for publication. Signature of the CTA is a condition of publication and papers will not be passed to the publisher for production unless a signed form has been received. After submission authors will retain the right to publish their paper in various media/circumstances (please see the form for further details).
